#### Workplace Danger

Assaults and Violent Acts was the 2nd leading cause of workplace fatality in 2007. United States Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2008.

- The 3rd leading cause of workplace fatality is homicide. *United States Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics*, 2008.
- Workplace homicides in the United States rose 13% to 610 in 2007 after a series low in 2006. *United States Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics*, 2008.
- Women were identified as more likely to be a victim of homicide in the workplace. *United States Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics*, 2008.

## Types of Danger

- Sales and Law Enforcement are identified to be at higher risk of homicide. *United States Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics*, 2008.
- In 2006, there were a total of 5840 workplace fatalities
- Assault or Violent Acts 788
- Homicides 540 Shooting 436 Stabbing 39 Self Inflicted 208
